Your background should be in the life sciences (e.g. biochemistry, neurosciences, molecular medicine) and you should be enrolled in a Bachelor or Master degree program.

Practical experience with cell culture and histology (cryosectioning) is preferred.

The work load is negotiable (e.g. 20-40 hours per month). The start date is July 2020. The position is initially available for 3 months. The working language in the group and institute is English and we welcome applications from international applicants.
